Why should a New Testament Christian bother to read the OT?

Col 2:17 These are a shadow of the things to come, but the substance belongs to Christ.

- ▶ Joh 5:39 You search the Scriptures because you think that in them you have eternal life; and it is they that bear witness about me,
- Joh 5:46 For if you believed Moses, you would believe me; for he wrote of me.

- ▶ So if we are to appreciate Christ, His work, His purpose, His message, the things He was talking about, the language He was using, many of the terms and certainly the concepts that He brings to us as He spoke and taught.
- ▶ Old Testament is the background that we need.
- ▶ Jesus is all over the OT:
 - □Christophanies, eg 1Cor 3:10
 - Typologies, People (eg Moses) Institutions(priesthood, kingship),
 - ■Messianic prophies

- There are 27 N.T books.
- ▶2,700 allusions to the O.T or quotations from it in the New Testament books
- Pof the 404 verses in the book of Revelation, seemingly **278** of them make some allusion to the Old Testament. That is **68.8%**

The Old Testament is three-quarters of the Bible.



- God did not say, "My goodness, look at all that time I put into those Old Testament books when the real action is in the New Testament."
- He said, "I'll give them everything they need to know in the Old Testament so that when I introduce Christ to them in His fullness, and when they see His purpose on earth they will be prepared for it."

2. The Fall


We are mortal


