Hebrews 4:12-13(NIV)

¹² For the word of God is alive and active. Sharper than any double-edged sword, it penetrates even to dividing soul and spirit, joints and marrow; it judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart. ¹³ Nothing in all creation is hidden from God's sight. Everything is uncovered and laid bare before the eyes of him to whom we must give account.

5. Ammon (1:13-15) intense cruelty


6. Moab (2:1-3) vengeance even on a king's carcass



Amos 1:11-12 (NIV)

¹¹ This is what the LORD says:
"For three sins of <u>Edom</u>, even for four, I will not relent.
Because <u>he pursued his brother</u> with a sword

and <u>slaughtered the women of the land</u>, because his anger raged continually and his fury flamed unchecked, ¹² I will send fire on <u>Teman</u> that will consume the fortresses of <u>Bozrah</u>."



Who was Edom?


• Descendants of Esau

Genesis 25:29-30

²⁹ Once when Jacob was cooking some stew, Esau came in from the open country, famished. ³⁰ He said to Jacob, "Quick, let me have some of that <u>red stew</u>! I'm famished!" (That is why he was also called Edom.)

What were the sins of Edom?

- Hatred and vengeance towards his brother, Israel
- Killed women (the helpless)
- Unforgiving and rage.



Very Hostile to Israel

Deu 2:4-6

⁴ Give the people these orders: 'You are about to pass through the territory of <u>your relatives the</u> <u>descendants of Esau, who live in Seir</u>. They will be afraid of you, <u>but be very careful</u>. ⁵ Do not provoke them to war, for I will not give you any of their land, not even enough to put your foot on. I have given <u>Esau</u> the hill country of <u>Seir</u> as his own. ⁶ You are to pay them in silver for the food you eat and the water you drink.'"

Numbers 20:14-21 (NIV) – They could not allow Israel to pass through their territory.

.....Then <u>Edom came out against them with a large</u> <u>and powerful army</u>. ²¹ Since Edom refused to let them go through their territory, Israel turned away from them.



Ammon

Amos 1:13-15 (NIV)

¹³ This is what the LORD says:
"For three sins of <u>Ammon</u>, even for four, I will not relent.
<u>Because he ripped open the pregnant</u> women of Gilead


in order to extend his borders, ¹⁴ I will set fire to the <u>walls of Rabbah</u> that will consume her fortresses amid war cries on the day of battle, amid violent winds on a stormy day. ¹⁵ Her king will go into exile, he and his officials together," says the LORD.



Who was Ammon? (Gen 19:36-38)

- From the descendants of Ben-Ammi, the "son" of Lot *incest with his younger daughter*
- Pagans who even sacrificed even their sons and daughters to the god, MOLEK.

1 Kings 11:7 – influence on God's people
⁷ On a hill east of Jerusalem, <u>Solomon built</u> a high place for Chemosh the detestable god of Moab, <u>and for</u> <u>Molek the detestable god of the Ammonites.</u>




Molek the detestable god of the Ammonites

What were the sins of Ammon?

- Oppression of Israel's women.
- Territorial raids

2 Kings 21:6 (Manasseh-King of Judah)

⁶ He <u>sacrificed his own son in the fire</u>, practiced divination, sought omens, and consulted mediums and spiritists. He did much evil in the eyes of the LORD, arousing his anger.



Moab

Amos 2:1-3 (NIV)

2 This is what the LORD says:
"For three sins of <u>Moab</u>, even for four, I will not relent.
<u>Because he burned to ashes</u> <u>the bones of Edom's king</u>,
² I will send fire on <u>Moab</u> that will consume the fortresses of Kerioth.

Moab will go down in great tumult amid war cries and the blast of the trumpet.

³ I will destroy her ruler

and kill all her officials with him," says the LORD.



Who was Moab? (Gen 19:36-38)

- From the descendants of the first "son" of Lot *– incest with his older daughter*
- Pagans who even sacrificed even humans to the detestable god, CHEMOSH (1st Kings 11:7)
